





Memorandum and Articles of Association of Lewisham Ethnic Minority Partnership (LEMP)

- 1. The Company's name is Lewisham Ethnic Minority Partnership (and in this document it is called "the Company").
- 2. The Company's registered office is situated in England and Wales
- 3. The Company's objects ("the Objects") are to:
 - promote the voluntary sector in Lewisham for the benefit of the public in general and in particular people of black and other minority ethnic groups, especially those who are discriminated against on the basis of colour, race or nationality;
 - promote equality and diversity by liaising between charities, voluntary organisations, government agencies and other groups on relevant issues including those that affect minority groups;
 - promote the elimination of discrimination by acting as a representative of the voluntary sector especially on behalf of members of minority groups in relation to government policies and legislation;
 - promote community capacity building by identifying needs in the voluntary sector and establishing projects and/ or policies to address them;
 - promote volunteering to add value to the community by utilising skills, knowledge and expertise of those who wish to be of service to the community in a voluntary capacity;
 - promote good relations between persons of different racial groups by bringing together persons who make up the community of Lewisham and beyond to exchange ideas; learn from each other and generally interact with one another;
 - promote social welfare improvement by developing programmes that seek to improve well-being and social interaction for all;
 - promote appreciation of culture and heritage, especially black and minority ethnic (BME) culture by participating in cultural and heritage events and working in partnership with others to facilitate and host events.
- In addition to any other powers it may have, the Company has the following powers in order to further the Objects:
 - 4.1 to raise funds. In doing so, the Company must comply with any relevant statutory regulations
 - 4.2 to buy, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any property and to maintain and equip it for its use
 - 4.3 to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of all or any part of the property belonging to the Company

- 4.4 to borrow money and to charge the whole or any part of the property belonging to the Company as security for repayment of the money borrowed
- 4.5 to co-operate with others: charities, voluntary bodies and statutory authorities to exchange information and share advice
- 4.6 to establish and/or support any charitable trusts, associations or institutions formed for any of the charitable purposes included in the Objects
- 4.7 to acquire, merge with or to enter into any partnership or joint venture arrangement with any other charitable organisation formed for any of the Objects.
- 4.8 to set aside income as a reserve against future expenditure in accordance with a written policy about reserves
- 4.9 to employ and remunerate such staff that are necessary for carrying out the work of the Company.

5 Funds

The Company may:

(i) deposit or invest funds;

(ii) employ a professional fund-manager; and

(iii) arrange for the investments or other property of the Company to be held in the name of a nominee - in the same manner and subject to the same conditions as the trustees of a trust are permitted to do by the Trustee Act 2000

(iv) to pay out of the funds of the Company the registration costs of the Company

6 Insurance:


The Company may provide indemnity insurance for Directors or any other officer of the Company

7 Liabilities

7.1 Liabilities are:

- (a) any liability that by virtue of any rule of law would otherwise attach to a director of a company in respect of any negligence, default breach of duty or breach of trust of which he or she may be guilty in relation to the Company;
- (b) the liability to make a contribution to the Company's assets as specified in section 214 of the Insolvency Act 1986 (wrongful trading).
- (c) Liabilities that result from conduct that Directors or other officers knew or must be assumed to have known was not in the best interests of the



NOTE TO MEMBERS:

For the LCPCG to effectively reflect the views of the community it is essential that representatives attend regularly. Attention is drawn to paragraph 19 of the Constitution: -

"Any organisation whose representative fails to attend three successive meetings (other than special meetings called at short notice) without adequate reason will be deemed to have resigned from the Group but may make application for re–admittance".

At the instruction of the Chair attendance is to be closely monitored.

At the discretion of the Chair further questions can be asked. On occasion it may be necessary to limit questions in order that the business of the meeting can be carried out within a reasonable time. It is hoped that this will ensure full and fair debate.
