








Do you think there should be a betting shop?




How do you feel about people smoking and drinking outside Ladbrokes?

This Sangley sandwich bar has been closed down. Meaning locals want this to turn into a shop like Tesco Express or other things like this.




If shops don't fit the criteria then they should lend the shop to another category which people would want




Have You Ever Had An Accident On These Pavements?




Do You Think The Pavements Can Be Improved?



Do You Think The Council Could Do A Better Job?




Do You Think The Pavements Are In Good Condition?





Solutions




- 1. The council needs to make the builders re-do the pavements.

- 3. When the builders re-do the pavements use a stronger form of concrete.











Solutions ideas

- Have police patrols in the area to make people feel safer when walking around in the area.


Have CCTV in the area to catch anyone spray painting or suspicious activity in the area so people will feel safe knowing that the area is being watched.

How does drug dealing affect locals?




Our solutions to Drug Dealing

- Raise awareness of drug to local people (e.g. putting leaflets in doors)




Do you think over flowing bins puts off visitors?

Do you think there are enough bins provided in the area?




Solutions for overflowing bins!




The profession of public health began in local authorities

- 23.5% all deaths under 1 year



Emergence of Chronic Non-infectious Disease









