Consultation on Draft Lewisham Cycling Strategy – consultation closing date 22.10.2017 at 23:59hrs.

Lewisham Council has produced the borough's first ever 'Cycling Strategy'. In it we look to set out key pledges to improve infrastructure and increase cycling participation over the next decade.

The Council are seeking views on the borough's first standalone cycling strategy which we hope to adopt as an official borough strategy by the end of 2017.

The document will set out the borough's aims and objectives to encourage and provide for cycling in Lewisham. Feedback will influence the content and priorities in the final version. Please read the draft strategy in the "Supporting Documents" tab before answering the survey questions.

Proposed Expansion of Greenvale School – consultation closing date 20.10.2017 at midday

The council are seeking the views of parents, carers, staff and local residents on the proposal to expand Greenvale School (Waters Road, SE6 1UQ) from 117 pupils to 210 pupils to help meet the need for places for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disability. This is an informal consultation that precedes the statutory consultation and decision process required for school organisational changes.

Proposed Expansion of Watergate School – consultation closing date 20.10.2017 at midday

The council are seeking the views of parents, carers, staff and local residents on the proposal to expand Watergate School (Lushington Road, SE6 3WG) from 108 pupils to 167 pupils to help meet the need for places for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disability. This is an informal consultation that precedes the statutory consultation and decision process required for school organisational changes.

Proposed Extension of Age Range of New Woodlands School – consultation closing date 20.10.2017 at midday

The council are seeking the views of parents, carers, staff and local residents on the proposal to extend the age range of New Woodlands School (Shroffold Road, BR1 5PD) to include Key Stage 4 to help meet the need for places for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disability. This is an informal consultation that precedes the statutory consultation and decision process required for school organisational changes.

Understanding Attitudes to Entering Local Politics – consultation closing date 22.10.2017 at 23:59hrs.

The Barriers to Politics Working Group is examining the barriers to those wishing to enter politics as a local councillor and, once elected, the barriers to remaining in post or progressing. This survey will support the Barriers to Politics Working group to establish what residents' perception of the role of a councillor is, how their expectations are set and what would support them to consider local politics. The perceptions and experiences of residents will inform the Barriers to Politics Working Group's recommendations to Full Council in November 2017.

What do you think about Lewisham Pharmacies? Consultation closing date 30.10.2017 at 23:59hrs.

Lewisham Council is conducting a survey to better understand local people's views on the pharmacy services locally. Pharmacies provide over the counter medicines as well as those that your GP prescribes. They can also offer health advice and information. Your opinions are valuable in helping us plan for the future to ensure high quality and easily accessible services.

The consultation aims to support and inform the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) which is a requirement for all Health and Wellbeing Boards to complete. The consultation will seek to get people's views on pharmacy services locally. The PNA will be used in part by NHS England to inform decision-making around approvals of new pharmacy applications in local areas.
