### **Residents' Charter for Estate Regeneration**

**Opened 5 Nov 2018 - Closes 16 Dec 2018**

Lewisham Council is committed to tackling the housing crisis and delivering 1,000 new social homes across the borough. The redevelopment of existing council homes is a crucial factor in the commitment to provide residents with improved housing.

### **Blackheath Common - Proposed Cycling and Walking Improvements**

The Mayor of London's aim for 2041 is for 80% of all trips in London to be made on foot, by cycle or using public transport.

LB Lewisham is working on initiatives to help reach this target by gearing towards a "Healthy Streets" approach as set out in the Mayor's Transport Strategy (2017) which encourage people to use their car less. This will help reduce the amount of dirty air in London, encourage active travel and tackle congestion on our already clogged up roads.

In July 2018, the Council agreed to establish a Local Democracy Review Working Group. As part of the review, we want to hear residents' views about how we can strengthen local democracy for everyone. Councillors will be attending local events and visiting community groups across the borough, and we have also set up this online survey so that all residents have an opportunity to share their views, even if they are unable to meet a councillor in person. The survey should take no more than 15 minutes to complete and the information you provide will help us to develop a set of recommendations to create an 'open and democratic Lewisham'.

### **Interested in joining the Whitefoot Assembly Coordinating Group?**

The coordinating group involves at least one ward councillor, one resident and one representative from the local third sector. The coordinating group is appointed from the wider assembly, and anyone who lives, works or learns in the ward can sit on the group. Additional members may be co-opted between appointments. Ideally the group should have between 6 and 12 members. The group helps to plan and structure assembly meetings to ensure the smooth running of the meeting and to ensure there is a diverse attendance from all parts of the local community

### **Roles and responsibilities of coordinating group**

Plan the agenda for each assembly meeting.

Provide advice on how to make assembly agendas relevant to the different communities in your ward and make sure meetings are planned to make them accessible and enjoyable.

Assist, where possible, in the practical delivery of assembly meetings.

Consider approaches to be used by the assembly in recommending the allocation of the Assembly Fund

Assess funding applications to ensure they meet the assembly's criteria.
