## 1. Purpose

1.1 This report informs the Mayor and Cabinet of the Children and Young People Select Committee's views regarding the Specialist Provision Programme.

## 2. Recommendations

# 3. Children and Young People Select Committee

- 3.1 On 19 January 2010, the Children and Young People Select Committee considered an update on the Strengthening Specialist Provision programme. This was an update on progress on increasing and improving provision since the Mayor agreed a series of principles and recommendations in relation to Lewishams specialist provision on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2007. This included establishing a new Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD) school and creating resource bases in a number of mainstream primary and secondary schools.
- 3.2 The Committee was informed by the Executive Director for Children and Young People that the rise in need for primary places has had an impact on the need for specialist places and proposals for more resource bases at primary schools will be brought forwrad after feasability studies, which are currently underway at a number of schools, have been completed. They were further advised that there is widescale pressure for reception places across London, and a significantly icnreased requirement for places was expected this year
- 3.3 The Committee are concerned to ensure that there are sufficient SEN places so that the SEN Review can be implemented as planned, particularly in light of wider places planning demands that were not forseen when the original

programme was agreed, and want the Mayor to ensure that the principles of the SEN programme are upheld in delivering the programme.
