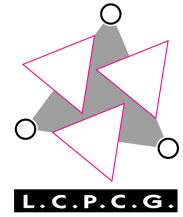

Notes

This meeting was a discussion based event, part of the consultation process for Safer Lewisham Partnership's (SLP) Annual Strategic Assessment and was led by their officers. These notes serve only as a simple record of the event for the LCPCG's own purposes.

During the first part of the meeting, Arseny Barkovskiy of the Crime Reduction Service gave a presentation on the findings to date from the 2012 Lewisham Crime Survey – which had 555 responses - and some of the other findings which will contribute to the Safer Lewisham Partnership Strategic Assessment.

Following that there was a mature and in depth debate between those present, covering a very wide range of issues around safety and perceptions of safety in the borough.

These included anti social behaviour; knife crime; successful work targeting criminal gangs; cycling on pavements; potential legal changes in how local authorities can deal with problem neighbours; dog fouling and park patrols; fly-tipping; the Lewisham Youth MARAC; the HEART Programme; causes of crime and social responsibility; street robbery; cowboy builders and theft by deception; and much more.

5 feedback forms were collected from attendees. Written feedback included “best part was to hear about audience's views ” “Presentation on Survey results was rather difficult to understand” “Workshop was useful session to involve everyone and possible ways to overcome problems such as anti-social behaviour” “Very constructive meeting”.
