


# Children & Young People Select Committee The future demand for school places

# 292,000 people live in Lewisham, the 13<sup>th</sup> largest population in London, and the 5<sup>th</sup> largest in Inner London

# Drivers of demand for school places in Lewisham


- A sustained high birth rate (see following chart)
- Inward migration
- ONS figures suggest that more families with school age children move out of the borough than move in (see following chart)

but the undeniable fact is that because population growth continues

- School rolls continue to rise
- Schools continue to deal with significant pupil turnover

#### Births (September to August) since 1998




### Change of borough of residence by families with school age children

- The net outflow of younger children is compensated by an increasing numbers choosing Lewisham schools at Reception (78.2%)
- This net outflow in later older age groups adds an extra variable to the preparation and use of projections



#### Projected demand for Reception places




- The baseline for supply is 3,853 places

#### Secondary Supply & Demand 2016-2025



- Baseline is the current number of Y7 places (2,667, 90 FE).
- Demand is projected on the basis of current trends of import and export
- Opportunity to export pupils may reduce as other boroughs demand rises
- However there is also the potential for additional supply from other boroughs

   Statements and Education Health Care Plans
- 23% of children have to be placed out of the borough or in independent schools

#### Future demand

- Careful analysis of trends suggest that there will be a minimum 7.7% increase in children with SEN over the next 10 years
- This equates to a shortage of 120 places
   there is expected to be an increase in the numbers
   of children with a diagnosis of
- Severe Learning Disability
- High functioning ASD (especially boys)
