The application is strong on explaining its place in the community and its offer to older people. They also reference in part, but in no detail, other services and how they fit within the need. However, is the no specific data or quantifiable evidence on need - at a ward level, Lewisham level, or beyond. With exception of referencing to immediate partners there is no reference to wider Lewisham assets serving this area of need, nor how they link and sit within this complementing the whole.

They refer to how they will go their charitable activities (as mentioned on their applications form under Safer Stronger Theme) but under the Theme they are applying for (CTC) they are not demonstrating any added value However it should be noted that they are asking for a smaller grant than previously in receipt of, to reflect their move towards a more self-sufficient future - so in effect they are offering around a 22% added value programme There is little innovation, smart objectives for improvement, or reference how they will work to attract other grant funding

	 hard to reach people who may be marginalised due to protected characteristics Gives little thought to how these can be improved and other engagement activities that make reap rewards and have not given any examples of plans to enhance their engagement plans The organisation suggest they will continue to carry on much as before, despite a drop in numbers and an acknowledgement that the needs of the community are growing There is no evidence of a successful track record in successfully engaging with hard to reach groups of people and or individuals – the care facilities they mention are a positive step forward, but again very limited to their doorstep There is no suggestion of establishing stronger partnerships with other organisations to develop referrals, or working closer with the local authority and NHS or primary care services to develop social prescribing opportunities and other referral links to their service in this section – these are primary sources to engage the hard to reach

However with the exception of a few, most of the partners listed hire space in the centre, they do not make clear that these partnerships are embedded and 2 way. Of their achievements it is clear that they have been involved in partnerships that have grown and evolved such as setting up VSL, developing a programme with SLAM and supporting the Lewisham Credit Union – however these achievements are historic We would have like to have seen some more specific achievements around the lunch club, their users and their team - which is their primary deliver under the CTC theme

Comments	 The board for the Grove Centre Church are in place with exception of the secretary role. The management committee of the Grove Centre directly deals with the centre and the Lunch Service The statement refers to skills audits and appears to have the appropriate level of skill required for an organisation of this size The statement indicates the appointment process but not how trustees are recruited from the wider community or user group Although the application cites the aims of the Church and Centre are aligned - It is unclear how involved the Church Board are with the day to day operations of the centre and vice versa

Overall comments/Recommendation

SCORE - 18

A mixed application which clearly demonstrates the use of the services provided but demonstrates significant organisational weaknesses.

The application does not demonstrate that the organisation have tried any other ways to secure the ongoing funding of this service, either through sourcing other grant income, or working with Fair Share to reduce the costs of food and work to help reduce food waste as other lunch services have done.

Officers have long signalled to all Main Grant funded groups of the need to change their delivery models to ensure they are not wholly funded by the council but unfortunately the organisation has not demonstrated that their primary offer under CTC theme is sustainable without full cost responsibility sitting with LBL.

It is not clear that anything is likely to change with the service with on-going funding.

It is clear that the Grove Centre are achieving its overall goal of supporting and encouraging charitable social action, through sustaining a "place for people" where all are welcomed – however this is not directly linked to the theme under which they are applying.

However, due to overall pressures on the budget and the desire to support a range of organisations who are providing significant added value it return for their grant funding this application is not recommended for funding.
