Overall comments/Recommendation

SCORE 28

The application scores well in some sections but has particular weaknesses, most notably around fundraising and financial stability, which will need to be addressed going forward. However, the application has identified a need and demonstrates an approach to delivering services that meet this need. Overall the activity which are considered to be most positive are the coordination and campaigning elements with the direct service delivery possibly being better delivered by others.

In determining the final amount for recommendation officers have considered the quality of a range of applications providing services designed to identify and address barriers to engagement of communities that do not traditionally access services or have a disproportionate representation within particular services.

Officers are mindful of the level of funding that has been requested and the range of scaling that the applicants have indicated in terms of their service offer but it has not been possible to distribute funds at the requested level to each organisation due to the number of quality applications in this theme.

Therefore officers are recommending a 'flat rate' of £35,000 per annum for services of this nature to ensure a consistent approach to funding. The intention is that these organisations will play a coordination and support role, working within a network of organisations, each giving a lead in relation to their specific expertise and forming part of the overall voluntary and community sector infrastructure offer.

As such it is recommended that the Pensioners Forum is awarded funding of £35,000 per annum to take a lead within the network in relation to issues facing older people. The range of services and areas of focus are to be agreed ahead of the start of the grant on 1 August 2019.
