Comments	A clear articulation of the need they are seeking to address. The organisation offers support to families with disabled children, working closely with a number of other organisations in the borough, none of which offer the level and type of support offered by the applicant. They state that the parents that they work with are provided with support in tackling issues relating to benefits and support that they are entitled to, with most of their new parents being referred by word of mouth. The organisation further works with families who are experiencing social isolation.

Comments	The application outlines the various partnerships that Contact is involved with, including statutory and voluntary groups. The organisation runs drop-in sessions at Kaleidoscope and is a member of the Children's and Young People's Forum where they represent their client groups. They state that their service is complementary to other activities and that they fill gaps, suggesting that there is no duplication. They highlight the value of their national helpline and online service, which provides integrated advice service for families with disabled children seeking advice on education, health, social care and child benefits.

Comments	The organisation states that without core funding, and also because their current Big Lottery funding is due to end, they would not be able to guarantee a physical presence in Lewisham. However, their helpline and online advice would remain available.

Comments	With core funding, the organisation states that it would provide advice for 125 families, provide workshops reaching 60 carers, provide four coffee mornings and eight outreach activities per year reaching 670 unique partner carers. The organisation also refers to its quarterly steering group and its quarterly newsletter, which is distributed to 850 families. The applicant identified the outcomes that would be achieved with their continued presence in the borough as a result of Lewisham core funding, including increased family independence and the leveraging of additional funding from other funders. There is a question of Value for money in the application given that the £65,382 will only fund a total of 1 FTE post but overall the outputs and outcomes are good.

Comments on value for money of revised offers	The organisation states that it would scale down its delivery to run fewer events and advice sessions and respond to fewer telephone enquiries and deal with fewer referrals. They state that they believe that the lower level of funding might mean that certain family types, particularly those who are harder to reach, might be overlooked. Representation on Strategic Boards would be reduced.

Comments	The application states that much of its engagement with those who do not traditionally access services would be undertaken through Kaleidoscope. They state that most families with disabled children currently access services through Kaleidoscope. They will use their partnership with Kaleidoscope to advertise their services to parents to help them understand the additional support which Contact can offer to parents and carers which is not available through Kaleidoscope or other child-focused support organisations. They further state that they offer a translation service for families whose first language is not English to minimise barriers to the service.

Comments	The application emphasises the organisation's commitment to joint working with statutory and voluntary groups in the borough to promote their service. They highlight their work with special schools such as Brent Knoll and Greendale. Their work also includes attendance at SEND Board meetings and other engagement events with statutory partners. Their work further includes raising awareness around the needs and issues of young disabled people. They have also undertaken joint work with Lewisham CAB and with DWP to work to support parents encountering changes to their welfare benefits. They have stated that their proudest achievements have been the higher level of outcomes for parents, supporting the Lewisham Parent and Carer Forum and fundraising activity undertaken by parents and families to enable the organisation to run social activities.

Comments	The organisation has stated that it has undertaken limited funding activities because, since 2016, their work in Lewisham has been fully funded. However, they state that, across the national organisation, they have a good track record of fundraising from wideranging funders and that they have established a number of relationships with corporate partners.
	The fundraising activity in Lewisham needs to be increased as a matter of urgency.

Comments	The figures presented are for the national organisation, with no figures disaggregated for Lewisham alone. The organisation has made significant deficits in the past four years which is of significant concern. Their reserves policy is to have free reserves of between £0.4 and 0.6 million, with current reserves at £673,719, which is 14% of their 2017/18 turnover.
	This reserve total is currently sufficient but clearly if the organisation continues to operate at annual deficits they will be insolvent within a matter of years – this needs addressing as a matter of urgency.

Comments	The Board Statement provides a clear outline of the trustees' and senior management team's responsibilities, stating that day to day running is by the senior management team and strategy is by the Board. The statement further outlines the recruitment process for trustees and processes for induction and training. There is no specific mention of a skills audit, although the application does state that it selects trustees for their relevant skills and experience.

Overall comments/Recommendation

Score = 28

This is a mixed application with a strong description of the needs of service users and the operational delivery of the project.

However, the overall financial health of the organisation and the level of fundraising undertaken locally both give cause for concern.

In general the services provided by Contact are rightly recognised as key support for families of disabled children and the application is recommended for funding.

However, overall budget pressure mean that this is at 75% of the amount requested with an acceptance that this will lead to some service reductions as outlined in the application. It is hoped that the fundraising activities highlighted as necessary above will help to bridge this gap.

Elsewhere in the programme officers have secured funding for the Lewisham Parent and Carers' Forum through other routes so it is hoped that this will offset the lack of strategic representation that may result from this reduced allocation.

Contact is recommended to receive £49,100 per annum but the overall financial health of the organisation should be kept under review as part of the monitoring of this grant.
