11. Big Budget Challenge

David Austin, Head of Audit and Risk, gave the presentation (attached), followed by a Question and Answer session (full Q&A available upon request)

12. Police/Safer Neighbourhood Team

PC Lana Gillard gave an overview of what the SNT are, how they engage, and rehighlighted the fact that the main issues in Brockley are Burglary and Vehicle Crime, however over the last 3 months these have seen a 40% and 30% reduction respectively. The floor was then opened to questions.

- Deptford Cinema Licence query – Cllr Kennedy to investigate, Police would just comment on potential ASB





The Council spends in total £1.2bn






The Council's net budget is £268m




Where the money comes from






How Government funding is falling






But demand is rising. Lewisham is one of the fastest growing areas in London.





Result on current projection is an £85m gap








Our online budget simulator gives an insight into the sorts of decisions that face the Mayor and councillors as they try to balance the books.

Brockley Assembly Fund

OPTION 1

- Brockley Survey Results are collated into an Action Plan
- Coordinating Group identify actions within plan that can be achieved without funding
- Remaining actions that require resource are then brought to Assembly meeting on 16 December
- Assembly vote to prioritise Actions for funding
- Application window opens, with deadline of 25
 January
- Coordinating group choose best value projects to fund based on geographical spread and beneficiaries
- **Projects funded in February '14** and invited to 17 March Assembly to inform people of what will be taking place, and how to get involved.

OPTION 2

- Brockley Survey Results are collated into an Action Plan
- Coordinating Group identify actions within plan that can be achieved without funding
- Remaining actions that require resource are then brought to Assembly meeting on 16 December
- Assembly vote to prioritise Actions for funding
- Application window opens, with deadline of 25
 January
- Coordinating group pre-assess projects to ensure they meet the criteria
- Relevant projects are invited to 17 March Assembly to present themselves and allow Assembly to vote on who should deliver the actions.
