A3	10-12 Royal Parade SE3	<p>IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE, THE COMMITTEE HAS CONSIDERED THE RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS MADE.</p> <p>The Committee has made the following determination:</p> <p>With a view to ensuring the promotion of the licensing objectives, in accordance with the provisions of the statutory guidance and the principles of our licensing policy, the application for a new Premises Licence, was GRANTED subject to the following conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Intoxicating Liquor shall not be sold or supplied on the premises other than to persons taking a substantial table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to that meal. 2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available upon the request of Police or authorized officer throughout the preceding 31-day period 3. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorized council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested. 4. The premises shall prominently display signage within the premises informing customers:- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CCTV is in operation throughout these premises and is made available to the police / Local authority on request. • A notice at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of the local

A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 21, shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are (recognized photographic identification cards, such as a driving license or passport / Holographical marked PASS scheme identification cards) appropriate signage must be displayed.</p> <p>6. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open.</p> <p>7. 		<p>licensing authority on reasonable request. This training is to be refreshed every 12 months. All new staff must undergo this training before being allowed to sell alcohol.</p> <p>10. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises (including the smoking area) e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or containers with them unless using tables and chairs outside.</p> <p>11. The outside seating area must be closed by 22:00hrs and patrons wishing to smoke outside after 22:00hrs shall not be permitted to take drinks outside with them. This condition remains in force until the beginning of the next days trading.</p> <p>In coming to a determination the Committee considered the following matters;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Committee noted the representations made by residents. The premises has been associated with a previous business which regularly undermined the 4 licensing objectives. Residents were also concerned that the premises would be open late and run as a nightclub. 2. The Committee noted the representation made by the applicant. He has had businesses in Blackheath for over 50 years and knows the area well. His family will be living above the premises and he would not allow any noise to disturb them. 3. The Committee noted that the applicant intends to run a business similar to the previous restaurant CAU at the premises. There will not be any live music and will not be run as a night club. Although the restaurant can remain open until 0200 hrs Tuesday to Sunday, the premises will not always be open as late as this.

		<p>4. The Committee noted that this is a family business and they are willing to address the concerns of local residents. They have stated that they would be willing to show residents around their restaurant and give them a contact number if there are ever any problems at the premises.</p> <p>5. The Committee noted that although the premises is in a Cumulative Impact Zone, statutory authorities had not made representations. This is a new application and the objections were, therefore, only supposition.</p> <p>6. The Committee noted that the applicant agreed to the conditions recommended by the Police and licensing officers and granting the application would promote the four licensing objectives.</p>
