### **A New Vision for New Cross - Area Framework and Station Opportunity Study Opened 12 Oct 2018 - Closes 14 Dec 2018**

The proposed Bakerloo Line extension could bring huge benefits to the New Cross area. Through this consultation page/material you can find out how we are planning ahead so that we can take advantage of the benefits a new station interchange might bring to the area, and how you can get involved.

## **Interested in joining the Downham Assembly Coordinating Group?**

The coordinating group involves at least one ward councillor, one resident and one representative from the local third sector.

The coordinating group is appointed from the wider assembly, and anyone who lives, works or learns in the ward can sit on the group. Additional members may be co-opted between appointments. Ideally the group should have between 6 and 12 members.

The group helps to plan and structure assembly meetings to ensure the smooth running of the meeting and to ensure there is a diverse attendance from all parts of the local community.
