Our new <u>Corporate Strategy</u> sets out how Lewisham Council plans to deliver for our residents over the next four years.

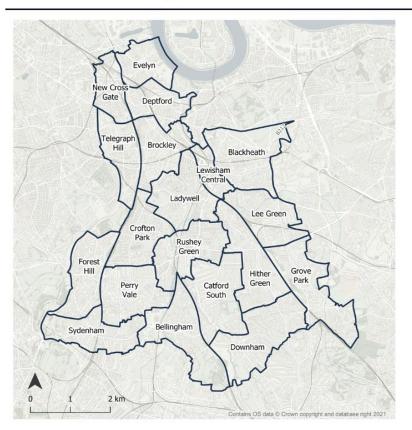
