Early Childhood Offer	Services and activities for families with 0-5 years olds with the aim of improving outcomes and reducing inequalities with a focus on child development and school readiness; parenting aspirations and parenting skills; and child and family health and life chances.
Children and Family Centre	Children and Family Centres are a place where families can access a range of health, education, play, parenting and family support services.
Co production	Here it is about designing services with those who may use them alongside those who have provided them.
Co location	More than one service or organisation in one location.

Evidence-based programmes	Evidence-based programmes have research evidence behind them and are proven to achieve positive outcomes.
EYA	Early Years Alliance
Family Help	The aim of Family Help is to improve children's lives through supporting the family unit and strengthening family relationships to enable children to thrive and keep families together, helping them to provide the safe, nurturing environments that children need.
Family Hubs	Family Hubs are for families with babies, children and young people from birth until they reach the age of 19 (or up to 25 for young people with special educational needs and disabilities). They bring together different services to offer guidance and advice on a range of circumstances including, infant feeding, mental health support, health visits and parenting classes.
Hub and Spoke model	The hub is one central location with the spokes being other locations that make up the whole model.
ICB	Integrated Care Board
Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT)	Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT), is a mental health service, that provides support for individuals with mild to moderate anxiety and depression.
Local Population Needs Assessment	A systematic method for reviewing the characteristics of a population and their needs, leading to agreed priorities and resource allocation that will improve health and wellbeing and reduce inequalities.
Reducing Parental Conflict	Reducing Parental Conflict programme is a Department for Works and Pensions programme to reduce parental conflict and improve children's outcomes.
SEND	Special Educational Needs and Disabilities
Service Level Agreements	An agreement between two or more which sets out services, priorities and responsibilities, in this case schools and the local authority.
Stakeholder	A party that has an interest in the service - professionals working with children, young people and families.

Start for Life Programme	Department for Education programme which joins up and enhances services delivered through family hubs ensuring all families can access the support they need for 0-2 year olds and their families
Trauma-informed	Trauma-informed practice is an approach to health and care interventions which is grounded in the understanding that trauma exposure can impact an individual's neurological, biological, psychological and social development.
