Agreement with the police and Licensing authority to amendment in original Hours

The restaurant will close at:

- 00:30 hours on Monday – Thursday instead of 02:00. Takeaway and deliveries **only** can continue until 02:00 hours

The restaurant will close at:

- 02:00 hours on Friday & Saturdays. Takeaway and deliveries **only** can continue until 04:00 hours.
- Sunday hours as applied until 00:00

Note: The licence holder agreed all proposed conditions from the police and the licensing authority, The hours proposed by both contradicted each other and as a result the lesser of the 2 will supersede the later hours proposed. The authorised hours for licensable activities will be as follows:

Until 00:30 Monday to Thursday

Until 02:00 Friday and Saturday

Until 00:00 Sunday (as applied)

Seasonal Variation Any day preceding a Bank Holiday until 02:00

Jamaican Independence Day (6th August) until 02:00

Conditions agreed with the licensing Authority.

1.No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day.

2.During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

3.The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking in the rear garden and the outside seating area to the front of the premises do so in an orderly manner so as not to cause a public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

Conditions agreed with the Police.

4.Front outside seating area to close by 22:00 and any seating removed

5.Rear garden not to be used by patrons

6.The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by a person as ancillary to their meal

7.The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service only.

8.All sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.

9.Smoking area solely at the front of the venue and limited to 4 people at a time after 22:0. (Supports the Licensing Objective Prevention of Public Nuisance).

Conditions Offered by the applicant on Part M of the application form

10.The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorized officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. The CCTV system should be updated and maintained according to police recommendations.

11.A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorized council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

12.An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorized Local Authority or Police Officer, which will record the following:

- a) All crimes reported to the venue.
- b) All ejections of patrons.
- c) Any complaints received.
- d) Any incidents of disorder.
- e) All seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
- f) Any faults in the CCTV system.
- g) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
- h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

13.Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

14.There will be a clear warning at the point of order that alcohol will only be delivered to someone over the age of 18 and that appropriate identification may be requested.

15.The delivery of alcohol will not be made to a person in a public place such as a street corner, park or bus stop etc.

16.A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 25, must be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are (recognized photographic identification cards, such as a driving license or passport / Holographical marked PASS scheme identification cards) appropriate signage must be displayed.
