The Mayor of London has launched a new taskforce to tackle the digital divide, and amongst other issues support children in need. He has allocated £1.5m over the next two years for this, part of the work will be to map out reliable connectivity across London. At a recent Webinar chaired by the Mayor of London, it was also mentioned that if there are issues with Wi-Fi hotspots in individual boroughs to let the taskforce team know. Ofcom estimates over 880,000 UK children have only a mobile internet connection at home.

The task and finish group can work alongside schools/officers to help identify those households most in need. This will also provide detailed information for targeted pupil support and to pass on to the taskforce team, along with specific, up-to-date information for inclusion in future applications for external funding.

Policy Context

How does the proposal support delivery of the Lewisham Corporate Strategy; national/regional policies, initiatives; legislation etc. I believe this proposal will help us identify and better support the educational achievements, and outcomes, for those Lewisham pupils who will be reliant on a good network connection, both now and in the future. In addition to this it will support the Level-up agenda aimed at ensuring children get guaranteed access to learning.
