Events will include intergenerational audiences. Sixty-four percent of participants are young women dealing with sexual harassment, intimidation and/or violence

METRO's Risk and Resilience programme (RRP) is an early intervention programme that provides sex, identity and relationship mentoring to young people. The service takes a holistic view of sex and relationship education and goes beyond delivering practical health information, recognising that sex and relationship behaviours are linked to much broader identity and attitude issues.

The RRP will impact communities across the borough by working at the earliest opportunity with young people displaying harmful behaviours, including harmful sexual behaviours. The programme supports young people to become critical thinkers, build their emotional literacy, and provide practical knowledge and skills around healthier sex, relationships, and communication with their peers. 30 – 40% of beneficiaries are expected to be BAME.
